# MONTHLY REPORT ON INDIGENOUS CRUDE OIL PRODUCTION, IMPORT AND PROCESSING

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## PRODUCTION, IMPORT AND EXPORT OF PETROLEUM PRODUCTS

January 2019

1. In this report, indigenous crude oil production, imports and processing as well as production and imports/exports of petroleum products by oil companies are analyzed on a monthly basis to assess the domestic availability of petroleum products in the country for consumption.

#### **Highlights**

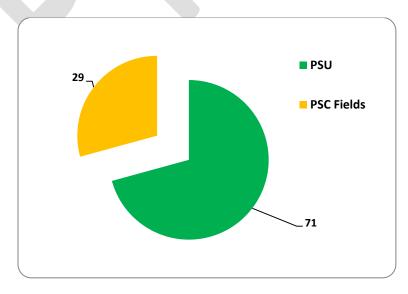
- Indigenous crude oil and condensate production during January 2019 was lower by 4.3% than that of January 2018. ONGC, OIL and PSC fields registered de-growth of 3.8%, 10.7% and 3.3% respectively during January 2019 as compared to January 2018. On cumulative basis de-growth of 3.8% was registered during April 2018 January 2019 over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Total crude oil processed during January 2019 was 21.9 MMT, which was a decrease
  of 3.6% over January 2018. On cumulative basis an increase of 1.8% was registered
  in the total crude oil processed during April 2018 January 2019 over the
  corresponding period of the previous year.
- Production of petroleum products during January 2019 saw a de-growth of 2.6% over January 2018. On cumulative basis an increase of 3.4% was registered in the total production of petroleum products during April 2018 January 2019 over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Crude oil imports decreased by 1.9% during January 2019 and increased by 3.2% during April 2018 January 2019 as compared to the same period of the previous year.
- Product imports decreased by 3.6% during January 2019 and 10.1% during April 2018 January 2019 over the corresponding period of the previous year. Decrease in POL product imports during April 2018 January 2019 was mainly due to decrease in imports of HSD and petcoke.
- Exports of products decreased by 24.3% during January 2019 and 8.6% during April 2018 January 2019 over the corresponding period of the previous year. Decrease in POL product exports during April 2018 January 2019 was due to decrease in exports of MS, naphtha, HSD, LOBS/lube Oil, FO, bitumen and VGO.

#### 2. Indigenous crude oil and condensate production

- 2.1. Production of indigenous crude oil and condensate registered a de-growth of 4.3% during January 2019 as compared to January 2018 and a de-growth of 3.8% during April 2018 January 2019 as compared to April 2017 January 2018.
- OIL's crude oil production in January 2019 was lower by 10.7% as compared to the production during January 2018. OIL's crude oil production registered a de-growth of 2.2% during April 2018 January 2019 as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year.
- In case of ONGC, crude oil and condensate production in January 2019 was lower by 3.8% as compared to January 2018. De-growth of 5.4% in production was recorded during April 2018 January 2019 vis- a- vis April 2017 January 2018.
- Indigenous crude oil and condensate production under PSC fields decreased by 3.3% during January 2019 as compared to January 2018. On cumulative basis the PSC field's production during April 2018 January 2019 was 0.6% lower than the crude oil and condensate production during April 2017 January 2018.

The percentage share of PSU upstream companies and PSC fields in overall crude oil and condensate production during April 2018 - January 2019 (P) is shown in figure-1 below:

The percentage share of ONGC in overall crude oil production including condensate decreased during April 2018 - January 2019<sup>)</sup> as compared to April 2017- January 2018 while the share of OIL and PSC fields increased during April 2018 - January 2019 as compared to April 2017 - January 2018. The comparison is shown in figure-2 below:

#### 3. Crude oil processing by Oil Companies

- 3.1. Total crude oil processed by Indian refineries was 21.9 MMT during January 2019 and 214.6 MMT during April 2018 January 2019.
- During January 2019 crude oil processed was lower by 3.6% over January 2018.
   However during April 2018 January 2019 crude oil processed was higher by 1.8% over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Refineries processed 74.4% of high sulphur crudes during January 2019 as compared to 77.1% in January 2018. During April 2018 - January 2019, 75.8% high sulphur crudes were processed against 74.7% in the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Based on processing of indigenous crude oil/condensate and the country's domestic POL consumption, self-sufficiency of petroleum products was 15.3% in January 2019 against 16.9% during January 2018. During April 2018 - January 2019 self-sufficiency was 16.3% against 17.2% during the corresponding period of the previous year.

#### 4. Production of Petroleum Products

4.1. Details of production of petroleum products are given in Table-1.

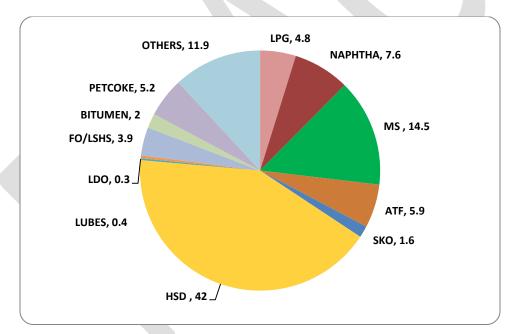

- Production of petroleum products from refineries and fractionators decreased by 2.6% in January 2019 and increased by 3.4% in April 2018 - January 2019 over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- LPG production registered a de-growth of 1.7% during January 2019 over January 2018. However growth of 3.4% was registered during April 2018 - January 2019 over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Naphtha production registered a de-growth of 10.4% and 1.5% respectively during January 2019 and April 2018 - January 2019 over the corresponding period of the previous year.

- FO production increased by 36.5% during January 2019 over January 2018.
   However a decrease of 3.9% was registered during April 2018 January 2019 over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Bitumen production registered a growth of 5.9% during January 2019 and growth of 7.4% during April 2018 - January 2019 over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Petcoke production decreased by 20.5% during January 2019 over January 2018 and by 1.6% during April 2018 - January 2019 over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- The percentage share of various products in total POL production during April
   2018 January 2019 is shown in figure-3 below:

LPG, MS, ATF, SKO and HSD accounted for 68.8% of total POL production during April 2018 - January 2019.

#### 5. Import of Crude oil and Petroleum Products

#### 5.1 Details of import of crude oil and petroleum products are given in Table-2 below:

- Crude oil imports decreased by 1.9% during January 2019 and increased by 3.2% during April 2018-January 2019 as compared to the same period of the previous year.
- Crude oil imports from OPEC countries decreased to 82.9% of total imports during April 2018-January 2019 as compared to 83.0% during April 2017-January 2018.
- Crude oil imports by PSU/JV increased by 3.1% and 8.1% during January 2019 and April 2018-January 2019 respectively over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Crude oil imports by private companies decreased by 9.6% and 4.4% during January 2019 and April 2018-January 2019 respectively over the corresponding period of the previous year.

Region wise crude oil import share during April 2018-January 2019 is given in figure 4.

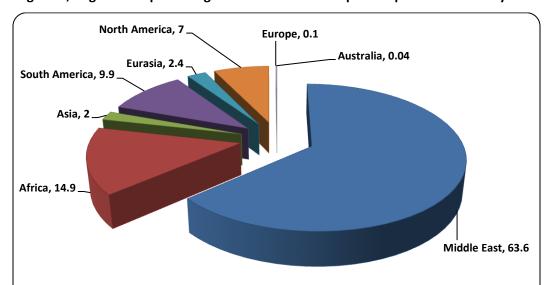
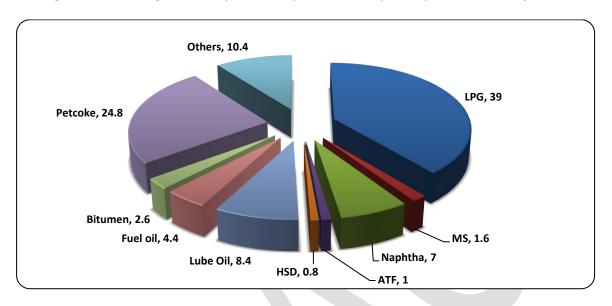


Figure-4; Region wise percentage share of crude oil imports: April 2018 - January 2019 (P)

- Product imports decreased by 3.6% during January 2019 and 10.1% during April 2018-January 2019 over the corresponding period of the previous year. Decrease in POL product imports during April 2018-January 2019 was mainly due to decrease in imports of HSD and petcoke.
- Imports of LPG and pet coke accounted for 65.9% share of the total petroleum product imports during January 2019, while LPG alone accounted for 38.0% of total POL imports. Further, 98.5% of total LPG imports were from the Middle Eastern region during April 2018 -January 2019.
- Petcoke imports, with a percentage share of 27.8% of total POL imports registered a de-growth of 4.6% during January 2019 as compared to January 2018.
- Imports of naphtha decreased by 51.2% during January 2019 as compared to January 2018. Private sector accounted for 92.6% of the total naphtha imports during April 2018-January 2019.
- Imports of LOBS/Lube oil decreased by 1.4% during January 2019 as compared to January 2018. Private sector accounted for 96.1% of the total LOBS/Lube oil imports during April 2018-January 2019.

• The percentage share of all major products in the imports of the country during April 2018-January 2019 is shown in figure-5.

# Other include Benzene, Hexane, MTO, Paraffin wax, Polypropylene, Sulphur etc.

- Exports of products decreased by 24.3% during January 2019 and 8.6% during April 2018 January 2019 over the corresponding period of the previous year. Decrease in POL product exports during April 2018-January 2019 was due to decrease in exports of MS, naphtha, HSD, LOBS/lube Oil, FO, bitumen and VGO mainly due to increase in domestic consumption of MS, naphtha and HSD.
- HSD exports decreased by 32.1% and 8.2% during January 2019 and April 2018-January 2019 respectively over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- MS exports decreased by 12.7% and 7.8% during January 2019 and April 2018-January 2019 respectively over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Percentage share of POL exports by PSU/JV and private oil companies during April
   2018 January 2019 is given in figure -6.
