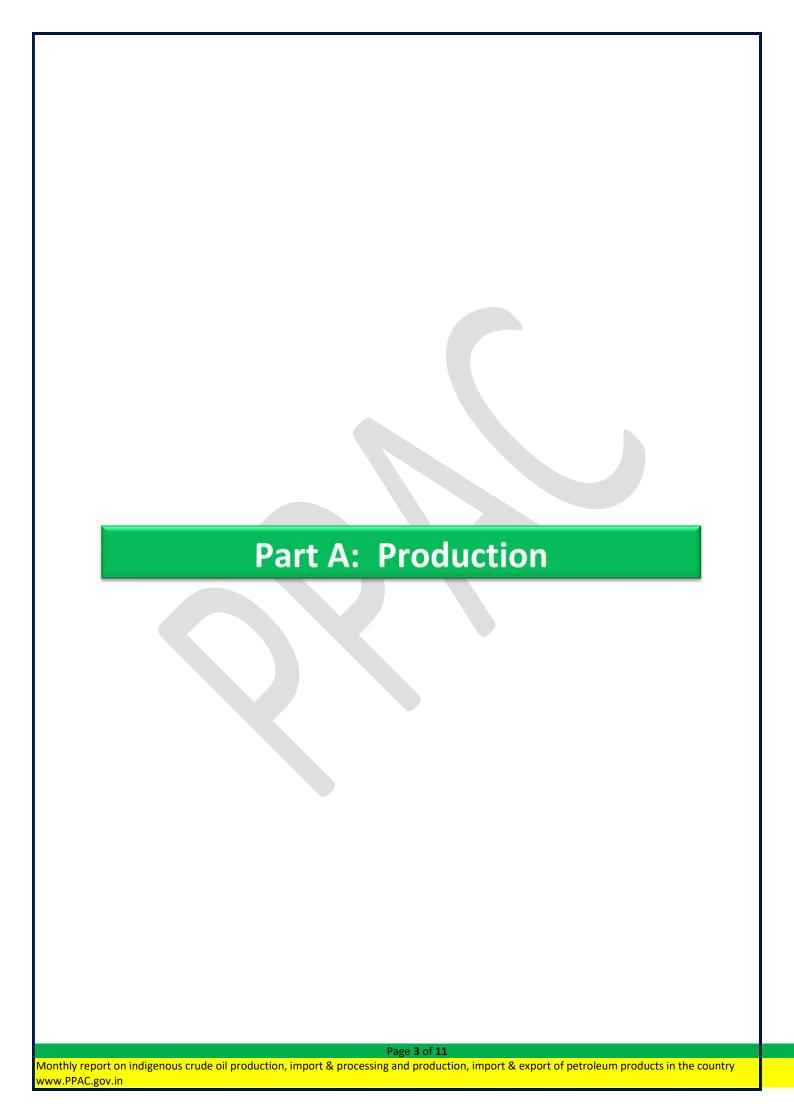

1. In this monthly report, indigenous crude oil production, imports and processing as well as production and imports/exports of petroleum products by oil companies are analyzed to assess the domestic availability of petroleum products in the country.

### **Highlights**

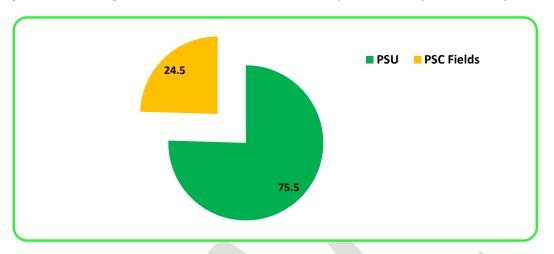
- Indigenous crude oil and condensate production during February 2022 and April –
   February 2022 was lower by 2.2 % and 2.6 % respectively as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Crude oil processed during February 2022 was 20.4 MMT, which was 9.8 % higher than February 2021. On cumulative basis total crude oil processed was 219.4 MMT which was higher by 9.3 % during April – February 2022 as compared to April – February 2021.
- Production of petroleum products saw a growth of 8.8 % and 9.1 % during February 2022 and April – February 2022 respectively over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Crude oil imports increased by 15.5% and 8.6% during February 2022 and April-February
   2022 respectively as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year.
- POL products imports decreased by 1.2% and 5.9% during February 2022 and April-February 2022 respectively as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. Decrease in POL product imports during April-February 2022 were due to decrease in imports of petcoke, high speed diesel (HSD), motor sprit (MS), naphtha and superior kerosene oil (SKO).
- Exports of POL products increased by 18.4% and 10.5% during February 2022 and April-February 2022 respectively as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. Increase in POL product exports during April-February 2022 (P) were due to increase in exports of all products except LOBS/Lubes oil, Bitumen, petcoke/CBFS and superior kerosene oil (SKO).



#### 2. Indigenous crude oil and condensate production

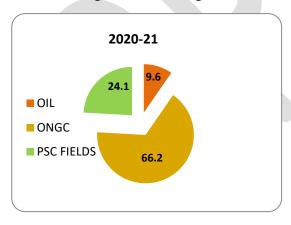
• The percentage share of PSU upstream companies and PSC fields in overall crude oil and condensate production during April – February (P) is shown in figure-1 below:

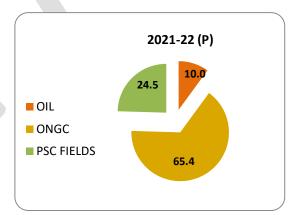
Figure-1; Percentage share in crude oil and condensate production; April – February 2022 (P)

Figure-2; Percentage share in crude oil production; April – February



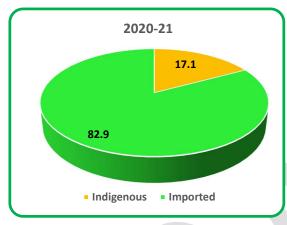

Figure-3; Percentage share of Indigenous/imported crude oil processed in PSU/JV refineries in April-February



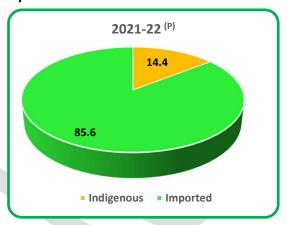
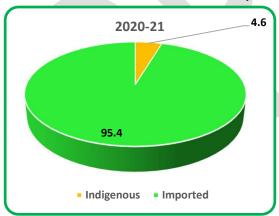


Figure-4; Percentage share of indigenous and imported crude oil processed by Private refineries:

April- February



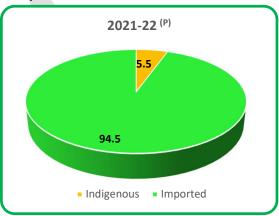

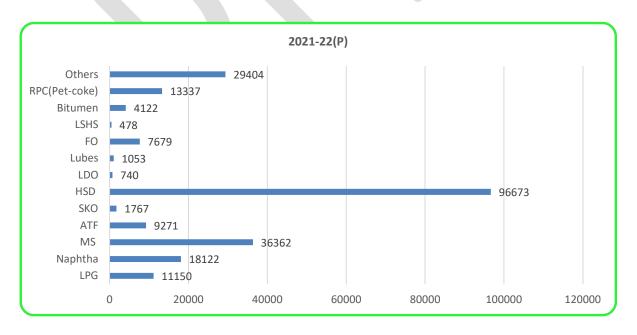

Figure-5; Product wise production of POL products by refineries and fractionators: April – February 2022 (P)

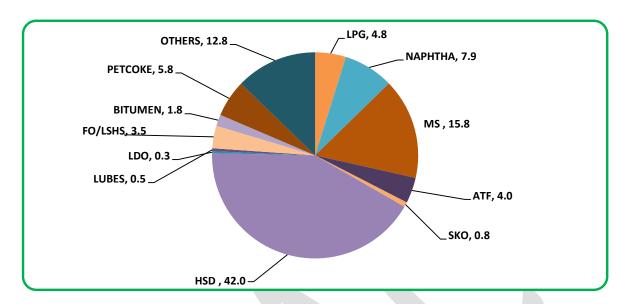


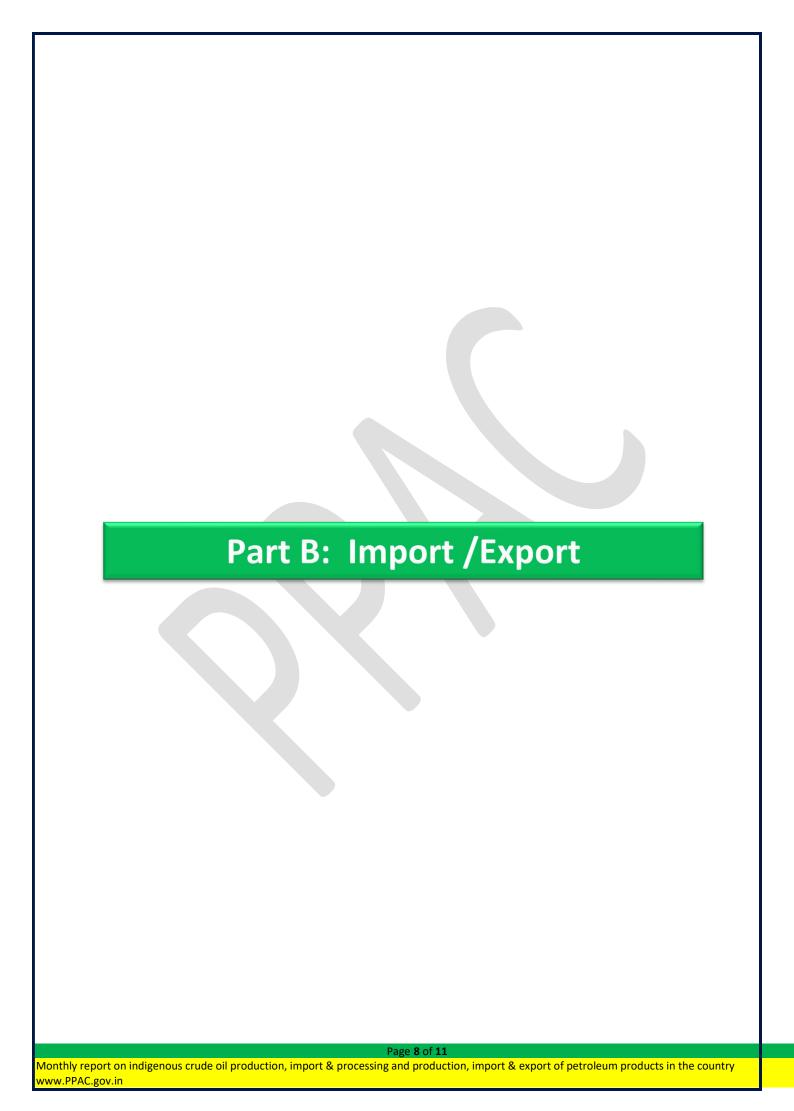

Figure-6; Percentage share of products in total POL production: April – February 2022 (P)



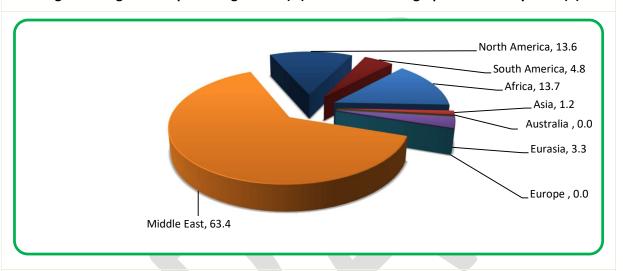

- Crude oil imports increased by 15.5% and 8.6% during February 2022 and April-February 2022 respectively as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Crude oil imports from OPEC countries decreased to 71.6% of total imports during April-February 2022 as compared to 72.3% during April- February 2021.

- Imports made due to deficit in production viz. LPG and Lubes/LOBS accounted for 50.1% share of total POL products import during April-February 2022 as compared to 44.8% during April-February 2021.
- Import of petcoke accounted for 10.1% of the total POL imports during April-February 2022. The entire quantity was imported by private importers.

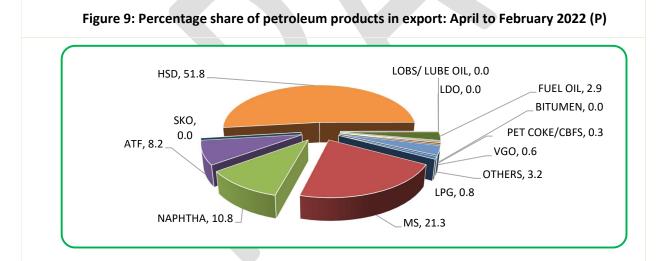

Exports of POL products increased by 18.4% and 10.5% during February 2022 and April-February 2022 respectively as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. Increase in POL products exports during April-February 2022 (P) was due to increase in exports of all products except LOBS/Lubes oil, bitumen, petcoke/CBFS and superior kerosene oil (SKO).
