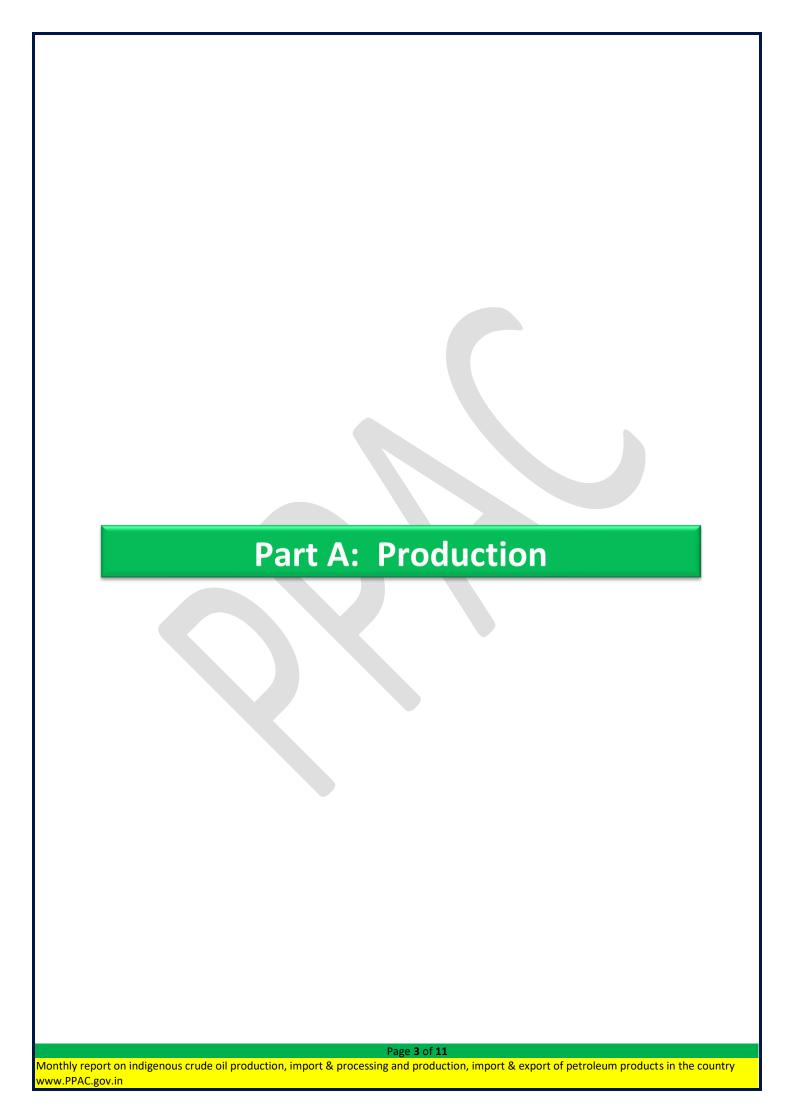

1. In this monthly report, indigenous crude oil production, imports and processing as well as production and imports/exports of petroleum products by oil companies are analyzed to assess the domestic availability of petroleum products in the country.

### **Highlights**

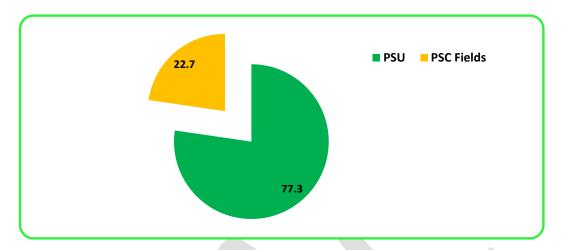
- Indigenous crude oil and condensate production during September 2022 and April –
  September 2022 was lower by 2.3 % and 1.3 % respectively as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Crude oil processed during September 2022 was 19.5 MMT, which was 7.3 % higher than September 2021. On cumulative basis total crude oil processed was 126.3 MMT which was higher by 11.5 % during April – September 2022 as compared to April – September 2021.
- Production of petroleum products saw a growth of 6.6 % and 10.1 % during September 2022 and April – September 2022 respectively over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Crude oil imports decreased by 5.8% and increased by 14% during September 2022 and April- September 2022 as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year.
- POL products imports decreased by 1% and increased by 11.3% during September 2022 and April- September 2022 as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. Increase in POL products imports during April- September 2022 were due to increase in imports of all products except aviation turbine fuel (ATF), superior kerosene oil (SKO) and others etc.
- Exports of POL products increased by 0.8% and 6.4% during September 2022 and April- September 2022 respectively as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. Increase in POL products exports during April- September 2022 were due to increase in exports of all products except superior kerosene oil (SKO), fuel oil (FO), naphtha and bitumen etc.

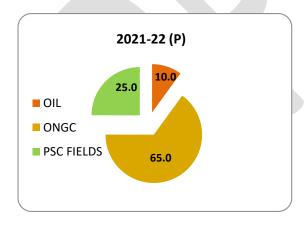
• The percentage share of PSU upstream companies and PSC fields in overall crude oil and condensate production during April – September (P) is shown in figure-1 below:

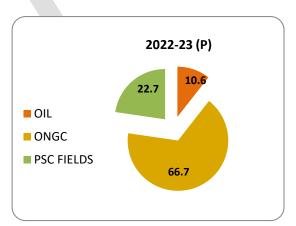
Figure-1; Percentage share in crude oil and condensate production; April – September 2022 (P)

Figure-2; Percentage share in crude oil production; April – September



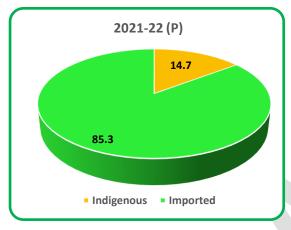

Figure-3; Percentage share of Indigenous/imported crude oil processed in PSU/JV refineries in April-September



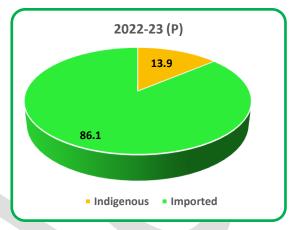
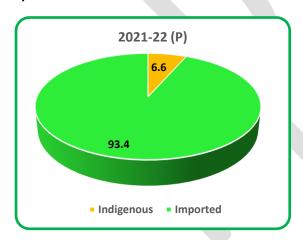


Figure-4; Percentage share of indigenous and imported crude oil processed by Private refineries: April - September



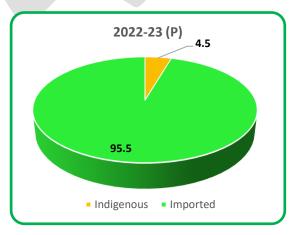

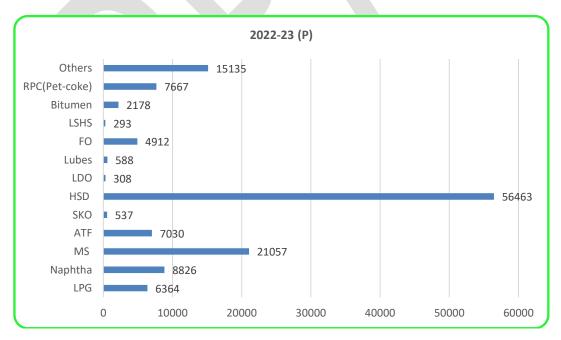

Figure-5; Product wise production of POL products by refineries and fractionators: April – September 2022 (P)

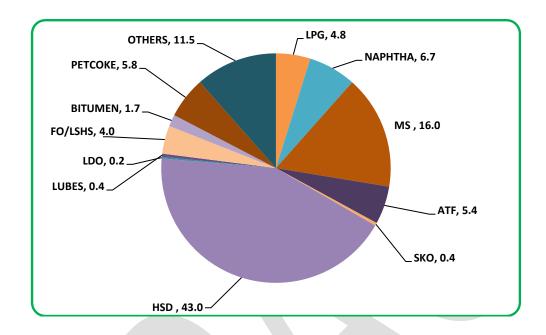

Figure-6; Percentage share of products in total POL production: April – September 2022 (P)

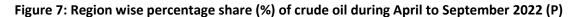


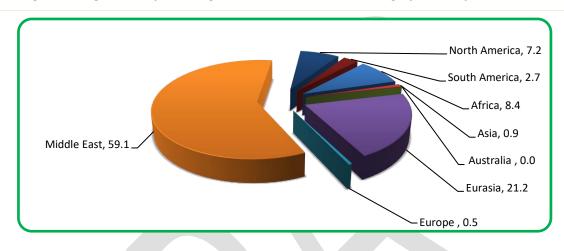

- Crude oil imports decreased by 5.8% and increased by 14% during September 2022 and April- September 2022 as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Crude oil imports from OPEC countries decreased to 63.1% of total imports during April-September 2022 as compared to 69.8% during April-September 2021.

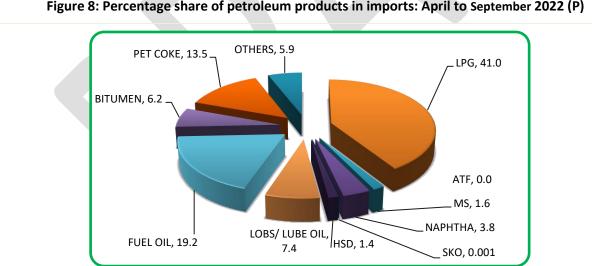


Figure 8: Percentage share of petroleum products in imports: April to September 2022 (P)

- Imports made due to deficit in production viz. LPG and Lubes/LOBS accounted for 48.4% share of total POL products import during April- September 2022 as compared to 50.6% during April- September 2021.
- Import of petcoke accounted for 13.5% of the total POL imports during April-September 2022. The entire quantity was imported by private importers.

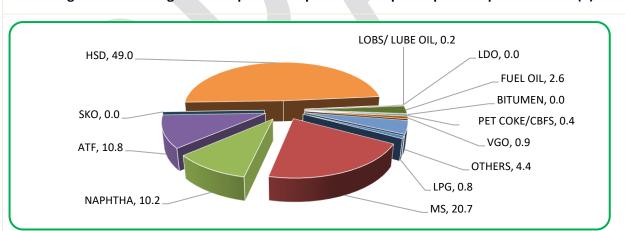


Figure 9: Percentage share of petroleum products in export: April to September 2022 (P)

Exports of POL products increased by 0.8% and 6.4% during September 2022 and April-September 2022 respectively as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. Increase in POL products exports during April-September 2022 were due to increase in exports of all products except superior kerosene oil (SKO), fuel oil (FO), naphtha and bitumen etc.
