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**1.** In this report, indigenous crude oil production, imports and processing as well as production and imports/exports of petroleum products by oil companies are analyzed on a monthly basis to assess the domestic availability of petroleum products in the country for consumption.

## Highlights

- Indigenous crude oil and condensate production during December 2018 was lower by 4.3% than that of December 2017. PSC fields registered de-growth of 1.7% during the month over December 2017. PSU companies OIL and ONGC registered degrowth of 4.7% and 5.4% respectively during the month over December 2017. On cumulative basis de-growth of 3.7% was registered during April – December 2018 over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Total crude oil processed during December 2018 was 21 MMT, which was a decrease of 5% over December 2017. On cumulative basis an increase of 2.5% was registered in the total crude oil processed during April – December 2018 over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Production of petroleum products during December 2018 saw a de-growth of 4.8% over December 2017. During April December 2018, an increase of 4.1% was registered in the total production of petroleum products over April December 2017.
- Crude oil imports increased by 1.1% and 3.8% during December 2018 and April-December 2018 respectively as compared to the same period of the previous year.
- Product imports decreased by 9.4% and 11.0% during December 2018 and April-December 2018 respectively over the corresponding period of the previous year.
   Decrease in POL product imports during April-December 2018 was due to decrease in imports of HSD and petcoke.
- Exports of products decreased by 12.0% and 6.7% during December 2018 and April-December 2018 respectively over the corresponding period of the previous year.
   Exports decreased during April-December 2018, mainly due to increase in domestic consumption of all products except SKO, LDO, FO and petcoke.

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## 2. Indigenous crude oil and condensate production

2.1. Production of indigenous crude oil and condensate registered a de-growth of 4.3% during December 2018 as compared to December 2017 and a de-growth of 3.7% during April - December 2018 as compared to April - December 2017.

• OIL's crude oil production in December 2018 was lower by 4.7% as compared to the production during December 2017. OIL's crude oil production registered a de-growth of 1.3% during April - December 2018 as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year.

• In case of ONGC, crude oil and condensate production in December 2018 was lower by 5.4% as compared to December 2017. De-growth of 5.6% in production was recorded during April - December 2018 vis- a- vis April - December 2017.

• Indigenous crude oil and condensate production under PSC fields decreased by 1.7% during December 2018 as compared to December 2017. On cumulative basis the PSC field's production during April - December 2018 was 0.3% lower than the crude oil and condensate production during April - December 2017.

The percentage share of PSU upstream companies and PSC fields in overall crude oil and condensate production during April - December 2018<sup>(P)</sup> is shown in figure-1 below:

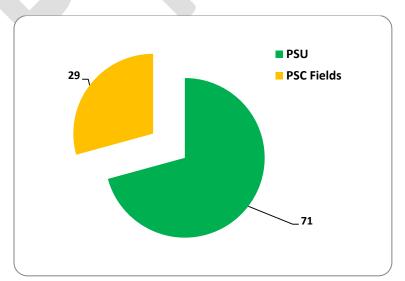


Figure-1; Percentage share in crude oil and condensate production; April – December 2018<sup>(P)</sup>

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The percentage share of ONGC in overall crude oil production including condensate decreased during April - December 2018 as compared to April - December 2017 while the share of OIL and PSC fields increased during April - December 2018 as compared to April - December 2017. The comparison is shown in figure-2 below:

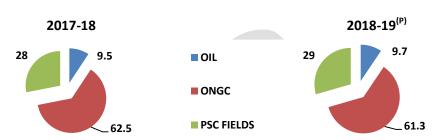


Figure-2; Percentage share in crude oil production: (April – December)

## 3. Crude oil processing by Oil Companies

- 3.1. Total crude oil processed by Indian refineries was 21 MMT during December 2018 and 192.7 MMT during April - December 2018.
- During December 2018 crude oil processed was lower by 5% over December 2017.
  However during April December 2018 crude oil processed was higher by 2.5% over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Refineries processed 75.6% of high sulphur crudes during December 2018 as compared to 74.7% in December 2017. During April - December 2018, 75.8% high sulphur crudes were processed against 74.4% in the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Based on processing of indigenous crude oil/condensate and the country's domestic POL consumption, self-sufficiency of petroleum products was 15.5% in December 2018 against 16.6% during December 2017. During April - December 2018 selfsufficiency was 16.6% against 17.2% during the corresponding period of the previous year.

## 4.1. Details of production of petroleum products are given in Table-1.

\* Others include products like Propylene, solvents (Hexane, Benzene, Toluene, Xylene and Specialty solvents), Reformate, Mineral Turpentine Oil, Carbon Black Feedstock, Waxes, Sulphur etc.

- Production of petroleum products from refineries and fractionators decreased by 4.8% in December 2018 and increased by 4.1% in April - December 2018 over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- LPG production registered a de-growth of 6.4% during December 2018 over December 2017. However growth of 4.1% was registered during April - December 2018 over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Naphtha production registered a de-growth of 0.6% and 0.4% respectively during December 2018 and April – December 2018 over the corresponding period of the previous year.

- FO production increased by 18.6% during December 2018 over December 2017.
  However a decrease of 6.9% was registered during April December 2018 over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Bitumen production registered a growth of 5.5% during December 2018 and growth of 7.6% during April – December 2018 over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Petcoke production decreased by 25.8% during December 2018 over December 2017. However a marginal increase of 0.7% was registered during April December 2018 over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- The percentage share of various products in total POL production during April -December 2018 is shown in figure-3 below:

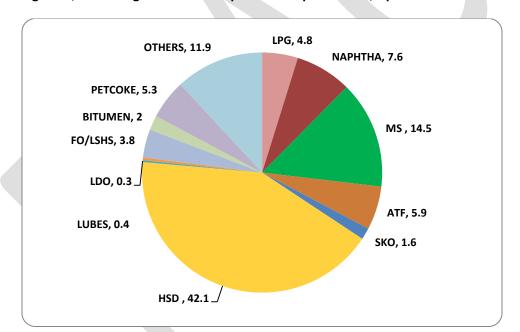


Figure-3; Percentage share of POL products in production; April – December 2018<sup>(P)</sup>

LPG, MS, ATF, SKO and HSD accounted for 68.8% of total POL production during April - December 2018.

## 5.1 Details of import of crude oil and petroleum products are given in Table-2 below:

# DGCIS October, November and December 2018 quantity prorated on the basis of October 2017-September 2018 actual data provided by DGCIS.

 $\$  Others include SKO, CBFS, Paraffin wax, Petroleum Jelly, LSWR , Aviation Gas etc.

- Crude oil imports increased by 1.1% and 3.8% during December 2018 and April-December 2018 respectively as compared to the same period of the previous year.
- Crude oil imports from OPEC countries decreased to 82.6% of total imports during April December 2018 as compared to 82.8% during April December 2017.
- Crude oil imports by PSU/JV increased by 1.0% and 8.7% during December 2018 and April - December 2018 respectively over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Crude oil imports by private companies increased by 1.2% and decreased by 3.8% during December 2018 and April December 2018 respectively over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Region wise crude oil import share during April December 2018 is given in figure-4.

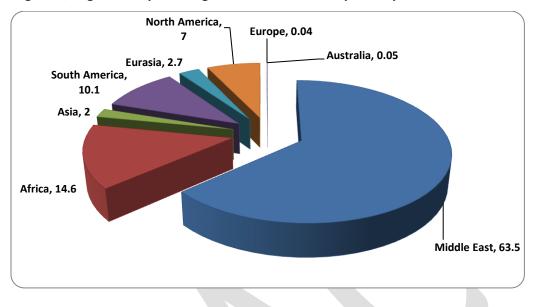
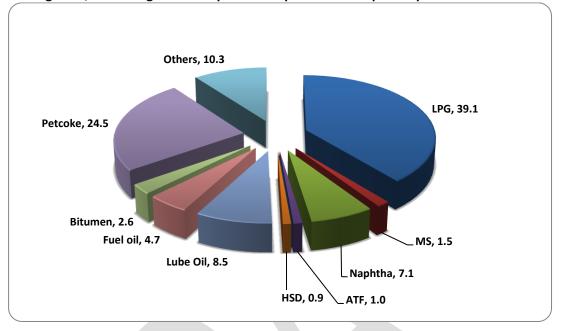


Figure-4; Region wise percentage share of crude oil imports: April - December 2018<sup>(P)</sup>

- Product imports decreased by 9.4% and 11.0% during December 2018 and April-December 2018 respectively over the corresponding period of the previous year.
   Decrease in POL product imports during April-December 2018 was due to decrease in imports of HSD and petcoke.
- Imports of LPG and pet coke accounted for 65.6% share of the total petroleum product imports during December 2018, while LPG alone accounted for 39.7% of total POL imports. Further, 97.7% of total LPG imports were from the Middle Eastern region during December 2018.
- Petcoke imports, with a percentage share of 25.9% of total POL imports registered a de-growth of 42.6% during December 2018 as compared to December 2017.
- Imports of naphtha decreased by 0.9% during December 2018 as compared to December 2017. Private sector accounted for 92.4% of the total naphtha imports during April - December 2018.
- Imports of LOBS/Lube oil increased by 7.2% during December 2018 as compared to December 2017. Private sector accounted for 96.1% of the total LOBS/Lube oil imports during April - December 2018.

 The percentage share of all major products in the imports of the country during April – December 2018 is shown in figure-5.

6.1 The details of export of petroleum products are given in Table-3 below:

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- Exports of products decreased by 12.0% and 6.7% during December 2018 and April-December 2018 respectively over the corresponding period of the previous year.
   Exports decreased during April-December 2018, mainly due to increase in domestic consumption of all products except SKO,LDO,FO and petcoke
- HSD exports decreased by 21.7% and 5.4% during December 2018 and April-December 2018 respectively over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- MS exports decreased by 10.3% and 7.2% during December 2018 and April- December 2018 respectively over the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Percentage share of POL exports by PSU/JV and private oil companies during April -December 2018 is given in figure -6.
