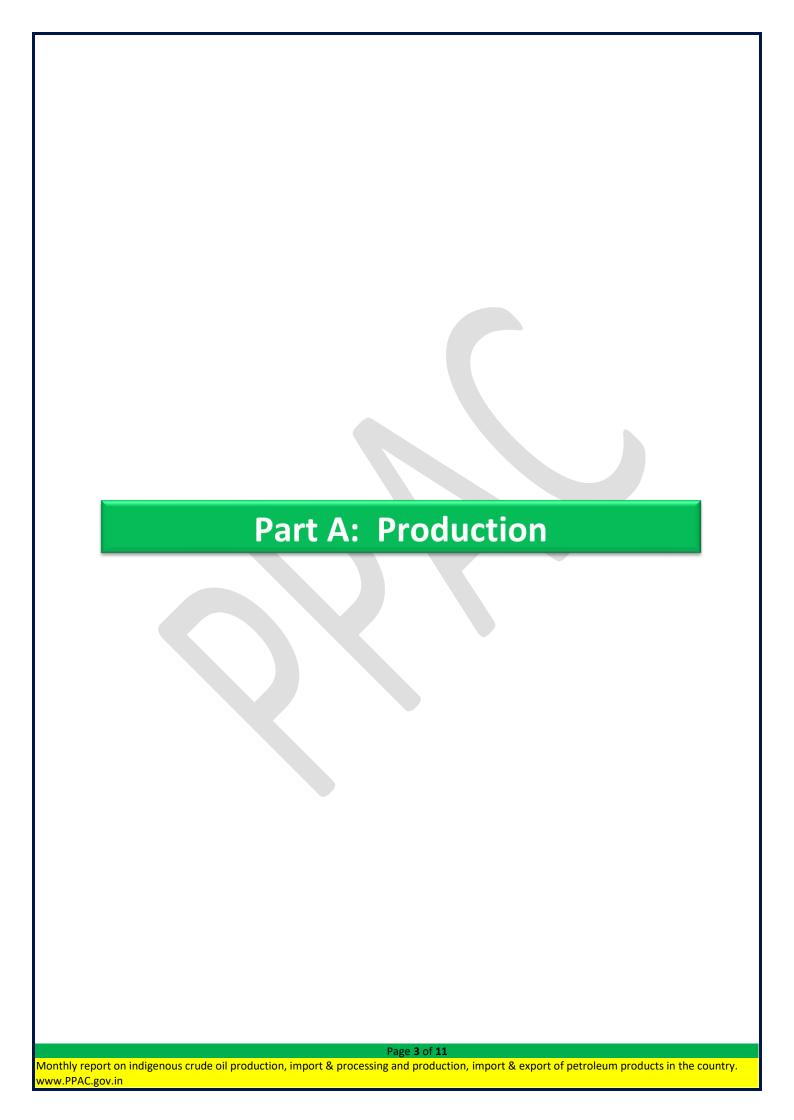

1. In this monthly report, indigenous crude oil production, imports and processing as well as production and imports/exports of petroleum products by oil companies are analyzed to assess the domestic availability of petroleum products in the country.

Highlights

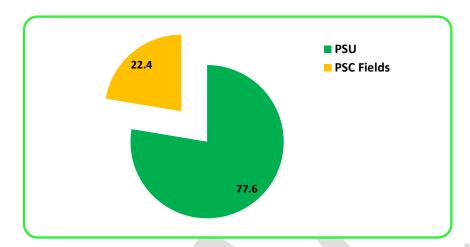
- Indigenous crude oil and condensate production was down by 1.7% and 2.8% during April- March 2023 and March 2023 as compared to corresponding period of the previous year.
- Crude oil processed increased by 5.6 % during April-March 2023 as compared April-March 2022. A growth of 3.0 % was registered during March 2023 as compared to March 2022.
- Production of petroleum products increased by 4.8 % during April- March 2023 as compared to corresponding period of the previous year, whereas there is a growth of 1.5% during March 2023 as compared to March 2022.
- Crude oil imports increased by 8.9% and 9.5% during March 2023 and April 2022-March
 2023 respectively as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year.
- POL product imports decreased by 0.7% and increased by 12.3% during March 2023 and April 2022-March 2023 respectively as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. Increase in POL product imports during April-March 2022-23 were mainly due to increase in import of all products except lubes/LOBS, fuel oil (FO), bitumen and others etc.
- Exports of POL products decreased by 10.9% and 2.7% during March 2023 and April 2022-March 2023 respectively as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. Decrease in POL products exports during April March 2022-23 were mainly due to decrease in exports of motor spirit (MS), naphtha, superior kerosene oil (SKO) and high-speed diesel (HSD) etc.



2. Indigenous crude oil and condensate production

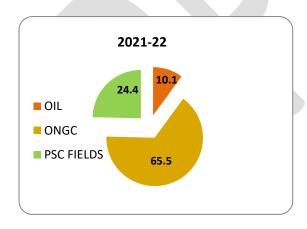
• The percentage share of PSU upstream companies and PSC fields in overall crude oil and condensate production during April – March (P) is shown in figure-1 below:

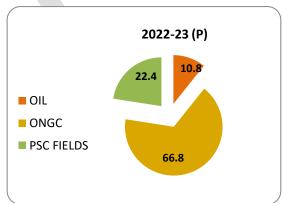
Figure-1; Percentage share in crude oil and condensate production; April – March 2023 (P)

Figure-2; Percentage share in crude oil production; April – March



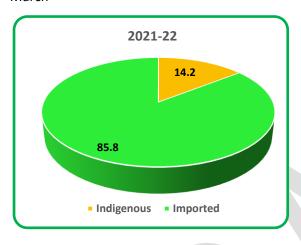

Figure-3; Percentage share of Indigenous/imported crude oil processed in PSU/JV refineries in April-March



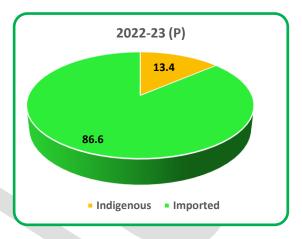
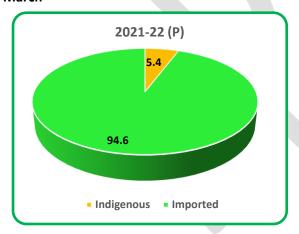


Figure-4; Percentage share of indigenous and imported crude oil processed by Private refineries: April - March



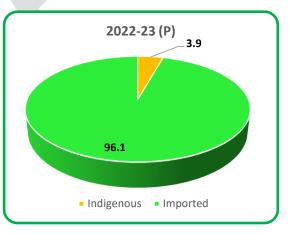

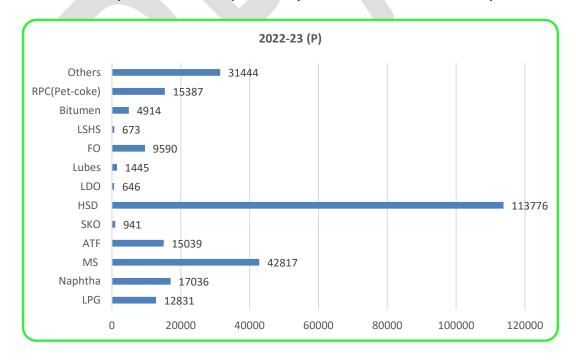

Figure-5; Product wise production of POL products by refineries and fractionators: April – March 2023 (P)

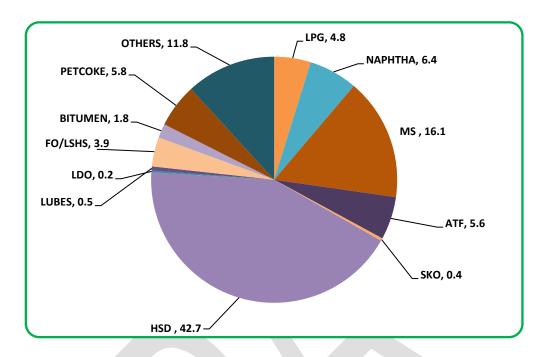

Figure-6; Percentage share of products in total POL production: April – March 2023 (P)

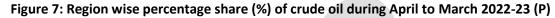


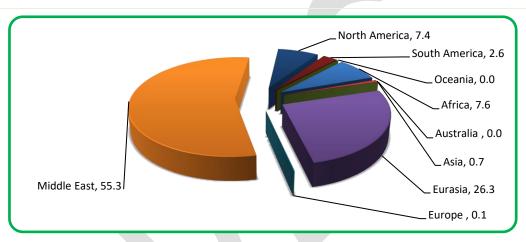

- Crude oil imports increased by 8.9% and 9.5% during March 2023 and April 2022-March 2023 respectively as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year.
- Crude oil imports from OPEC countries decreased to 59.5% of total imports during April-March 2022-23 as compared to 71.6% during April-March 2021-22.

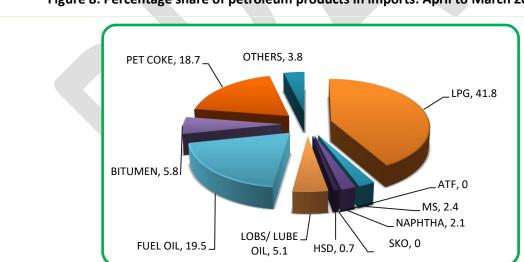


Figure 8: Percentage share of petroleum products in imports: April to March 2022-23 (P)

- Imports made due to deficit in production viz. LPG and Lubes/LOBS accounted for 46.9% share of total POL products import during April-March 2022-23 as compared to 51.5% during April-March 2021-22.
- Import of petcoke accounted for 18.7% of the total POL imports during April-March 2022-23. The entire quantity was imported by private importers.

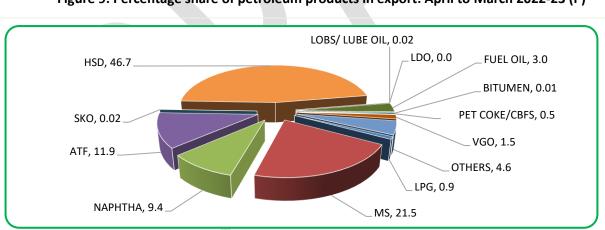


Figure 9: Percentage share of petroleum products in export: April to March 2022-23 (P)

Exports of POL products decreased by 10.9% and 2.7% during March 2023 and April 2022- March 2023 respectively as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year.
